MONTHLY STATISTICS


Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)





Fines

Fines collected, by the Logan County Circuit Clerk for Lincoln, during the month of June was \$3,183.68 bringing the total to \$76,554.36 for the calendar year.

Fines collected for Parking Tickets for the month of June was \$314.00 bringing the total collected this calendar year to \$2749.00. There is \$50.00 of issued parking tickets for the month of June that is pending as of this date.

DIVISION REPORTS

Patrol

While patrolling the streets in June, the officers wrote 87 written warning citations in addition to the traffic citations that were written in June.

Investigations

Open Cases Under Investigation for June 2015

- 3 Drug induced homicides, one from August 2014 and one from November 2014 and another occurring on Wednesday, July 8th 2015
- A residential burglary where 18 guns were stolen from the residence
- Fraud case involving credit cards
- “Swatting” incident on Decatur Street from May, 26th 2015
- Residential Burglary where thousands of dollars worth of old coins, vintage watches and other artifacts were stolen which coincides with the related Logan County case where over \$100,000 worth of Jewelry was stolen from a residence on Airport Road on the same day
- An aggravated criminal sexual abuse where the suspect is 34 years old and the victim being 14
- A burglary to a local towing company where the suspect stole his impounded car also stealing several items from the business and causing damage to the building
- A child abuse/neglect case
- A residential burglary where \$10,000 in currency and a safe was stolen

Closed Cases

- Two aggravated criminal sexual abuse case, both involving juveniles
- An aggravated robbery case with 2 suspects remaining in custody
- Fraud case involving the misuse of a credit card

DARE/Community Policing

June 6th – The family of Nathan Turner and DARE hosted a fishing derby at the Atlanta camp ground. We had the best turn out we have had in the history of the fishing derby. Using donated DARE funds Officer Christy Fruge purchased gift cards, fishing poles and tackle boxes for the winners of the largest fish, most fish, and smallest fish. Officer Christy Fruge also purchased hotdogs, chips and drinks for all of the kids and parents who attended the derby. Officer Jake Kitner helped that day by cooking the hotdogs.

June 19th – This year DARE ended up getting 29 teams in the 20th Annual DARE Golf Outing. This is the largest turn out we have ever had. All of the month’s of hard work paid off. When all was said and done around \$6,500 was put into the DARE account. All of this money will be used to benefit the youth of our community.
