Lincoln Police acquired two new Dodge Durango's from the Illinois State Contract.

Two New Durangos

Lincoln Police department has two new Durango's that are patrolling the streets. The vehicles offer four wheel drive for snow/ice/rain. The extra height offers a better view at occupants of other vehicles and makes it easier to see further in traffic. The vehicles have much more storage than the sedans the department has previously purchased.

The new vehicles are being outfitted with Dell Semi-Rugged laptops computers that are \$2000 rather than the fully rugged \$6000 Panasonic laptops that we had before. This is a significant savings for the city on future purchases.

We will be marking the vehicles soon, but for the time being they are unmarked.

MONTHLY STATISTICS


Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)




